Messiah's Mission Matters Team hosted our 5th Annual Drive-Thru Winter Clothing Collection on Saturday, January 11. A heartfelt thank you for your outpouring of donations!

It was a great opportunity to collect warm clothing and other items to help local people in need stay warm this winter. Your donations included these items: 104 pairs of socks; 95 hats/beanies/earmuffs; 81 coats/jackets; 56 long-sleeved shirts & t-shirts; 44 pairs of gloves/mittens; 39 kids misc. items; 36 hoodies/sweatshirts; 24 pairs of boots/shoes; 22 pairs of pants/snow pants; 21 adult misc. items; 15 scarves/gators; 13 blankets and 1 pajama set.

Can you hear me now? The Story continues...

Back in 2005, Verizon Wireless came up with one of the most iconic ad campaigns ever. Remember the guy wandering around with his crew of network engineers, constantly asking, "Can you hear me now?" The whole idea was to highlight how reliable their network was—and it worked. That simple catchphrase caught on like wildfire. Verizon's message was clear: they wanted to connect with their customers and help their customers connect with each other.

Here's the great thing: God's been doing the same thing—on a way bigger scale. That's what *The Story* is about. Even after his


Kingdom split in two, God kept

reaching out, giving people chance after chance to "pick up."

For 208 years, he sent messages through his "technicians," who we know as prophets, to remind people that he still loved them and wanted them to come back to him.

In *The Story,* we get to meet these prophets up close. And guess what? Their message hasn't changed. They're still saying what they said to Israel: "God loves you and wants you to come back home."

Just like with a call on your phone, you've got a choice. You can hit "accept" or "reject." You can send God straight to voicemail, or you can pick up and answer him today. The people of Israel had 208 years to decide, and they never picked up. But the network is clear, and the message is reliable.

A Message From Pastor Laurie

No King but King Jesus

In the early days of our nation, George Washington had the opportunity to become king of the fledgling country. However, given the colonies' experience with England and his deep commitment to prayer, Washington knew there was only one true King, and he declined the offer.


The people of the land seemed to share this conviction. In 1774, the Governor of Boston reported to King George: "If you ask an American who is his master, he will tell you he has none, nor any governor but Jesus Christ." This sentiment soon became the American motto among the pre-war Colonial Committees of Correspondence: "No King but King Jesus."



In *The Story* for the month of February, we will have a front row seat in the implosion of the nation of Israel. It can be painful to watch, but there are lessons to be learned as well. They forgot who their true King was. Instead, they demanded a human king and over the course of the kingdoms of Israel and Judah, there were 38 kings, but only five of them were faithful to God. The rest, as Scripture repeatedly notes, "did evil in the eyes of the Lord."

Despite their rebellion, God sent prophets to call his people back to him. Through the prophets, God warned Judah of coming exile in Babylon but also promised restoration: "Then you will know that I am the Lord; those who hope in me will not be disappointed. Then the whole human race will know that I, the Lord, am your Savior, your Redeemer, the Mighty One of Jacob" (Isaiah 49:23).

In Isaiah 53, the prophet vividly describes the coming Messiah: "He had no beauty or majesty to attract us to him, nothing in his appearance that we should desire him. He was despised and rejected by others, a man of suffering, and familiar with pain" (Isaiah 53:2-3). God didn't want his people to miss their Savior, but many did—and still do.





My prayer for Messiah is that we don't miss our Savior; that we don't forget to make him the main thing; that we remember to hold Jesus up and give him proper place in our heart.

Had Washington accepted the offer to be king, our nation's history would have been very different. But Washington seemed to understand a critical truth that when we displace God from his rightful place on the throne of our lives and our worship, the results can be disastrous. Conversely, when we place God at the center of our lives and our worship, we position ourselves for godly success.

Imagine what could change in our life and in our church if we adopted the motto: "No King but King Jesus." Let him reign in our hearts, and see what transformations unfold—both personally and as Messiah Lutheran.







Abundance is a characteristic of God. He gave His only Son Who declared to us, "I came that [you] may have life, and have it abundantly" (John 10:10). Through Him and because of the abundance of His love for us, we "believe in Him and rejoice with joy that is inexpressible and filled with glory, obtaining the outcome of [our] faith, the salvation of [our] souls" (1 Peter 1:8-9). Our Lord is also "abounding in steadfast love, forgiving iniquity and transgression" (Numbers 14:18).

As we have read through THE STORY, we have seen that God gives the gifts of His creation to his children. Can any of us count the stars in the sky, the birds in the air, or the fish in the sea? 





Towney of the Stones: Lenten Lessons for 2025

Ash Wednesday: Written in Stone † Exodus 32:1-9

Lent offers us a chance to reflect, to let go of the "stones" of our failures, and to place them at the foot of the cross. It's a time to ask God for grace and to embrace the Savior who redeems us, even when we fall short.

Wed. March 12: Rejected Stones ♥ Mark 12:1-12

Rejection is a painful experience, whether it's being turned down by a college, a job, or a relationship. It can shape us in one of two ways - either by building resilience and compassion or by fostering bitterness and anger.

Wed. March 19: Sticks and Stones ♥ John 8:2-12

This story in John of the adulterous woman asks us to examine ourselves. Are we casting stones or acting out of compassion?

Wed. March 26: Hearts of Stone ♥ Luke 11:37-47

In Luke 11, Jesus rebukes the Pharisees and scribes for their hypocrisy, self-righteousness and legalism. Jesus accused them of being "walking gravestones," spiritually dead and misleading others.

Wed. April 2: Upon This Rock + Matthew 16:13-20

This story in Matthew 16 begins with the disciples reflecting on who people think Jesus is, but Jesus shifts the question to something deeply personal: "Who do you say that I am?"

Wed. April 9: Crying Stones + Luke 19:29-40

This passage in Luke 19 reflects on Jesus' triumphant yet paradoxical entry into Jerusalem, where the joyous crowd celebrated Him as King while being unaware of the Pharisee's plot to end His ministry.

Maundy Thurs.: Stones to Bread ♥ Matthew 4:1-11
