

The Story of Being Found

One sunny afternoon, a young boy named Jack wandered away from his father while they were at the park by a forest. Caught up in the excitement of the trees, he didn't realize how far he had strayed. Panic set in as his father noticed he couldn't find his son. He called out, but the only response was the rustling of leaves in the breeze.

When children go missing, parents start searching. And that's exactly what Jack's dad did. Soon, the entire community was helping look for him. Search and rescue teams combed the area. One



Yes, when children go missing, parents go looking. And God has been doing the same for us throughout *The Story.* We began in September with Genesis, and now we are learning about the fulfillment of God's plan and the Great Commission: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations" (Matt. 28:19). In this month's chapters of *The Story*, we see how God sends us out to seek others for his sake.

There is no place on earth without his footprints. He started searching the moment Adam and Eve lost their way. He sent his Son to "seek and save what was lost" (Luke 19:10).

Today, he sends his church—he sends us. In Acts 1:8, we find his search and rescue plan: "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

We still have the same mission—to be witnesses for Jesus in our Jerusalems and in the world. We are called to search for those who have lost their way.

Let's make sure there's not a single square foot left without our footprints for the sake of the Kingdom. Just so you know—Jack was found, unharmed but a little shaken. Thank God for those who search for the lost.



Are you ready to make a difference? It's easier than you think!

As we continue to grow as a congregation, we are reminded of the purpose we find in serving others. The Bible teaches us that we are the body of Christ, and each of us has a vital role to play in God's mission on earth. This truth should inspire us to live out our faith—not just talk about it, but show it through action. Volunteering is one of the most powerful ways to put God's love into action and serve one another.

You should've recently received a letter explaining how we've split our church roster into 12 groups, with each household taking a month to help out with different ministries.

No matter what your gifts are, there's a place for you to make a difference here at Messiah, and we hope you'll embrace this opportunity to serve. When we come together in service, we strengthen our community and reflect Christ's love to everyone around us. Whether the task is big or small, it's all part of our

A Message From Pastor Laurie

I love golf. I don't get to play as much as I'd like, but it's definitely on my list for after retirement! I was on the golf team in high school, and I had a blast, even though my dad thought golf was the silliest game ever. He couldn't get why anyone would want to hit a ball and then chase after it—time and time again. The whole strategy was lost on him.

Butch Harmon, who's worked with everyone from Fred Couples to Tiger Woods, tells a story about a club member who kept struggling with shanks—those shots that just go all wrong. Butch spent 20 minutes trying to fix his stance, his weight transfer, his wrists, arms, shoulders, even his chin. He tried everything, but the guy kept hitting shanks.

Butch went to his dad, Claude Harmon, to see if he could help. Claude watched the guy swing once and then said, "Keep your clubface square." Five minutes later, the guy was hitting straight down the fairway.

Butch asked how he figured it out so quickly, and Claude said, "I knew what he was doing before I stood up from behind my desk. . . . A shank is a shank. I knew the guy was hitting it with a shut clubface before I walked out here. The only question left was, what did I need to tell him to get him to stop?"

In the same way, Jesus already knows what's causing the "shanks" in your life. He knows why your "swing" is off, and he already has the solution—even before you ask for help. He knows because he took care of the problem on the cross. Remember when he said, "It is finished!" (John 19:30)? That was the moment he paid the debt that we could never pay ourselves.

April 18 is Good Friday, although it is hard to call that day "good." Yet it was on that day, on the cross, that Jesus did the work of satisfying both God's holiness and his love. God's holiness is foundational to everything in Scripture. It means he's "set apart" and different from us—not just better, but completely beyond us. And because of that, he sees sin differently than we do. It can't just be ignored; it has to be dealt with.

But God is also love. So, he put our sin on his Son and took the punishment there. That's how he took care of sin—and you and me, too, when we embrace him as Savior.

So, just like in golf, when we let Jesus handle the "shanks" in our lives, everything falls into place.



We don't have to keep struggling with the same mistakes over and over. He's already fixed the problem, and the answer is right there in the sacrifice he made for us on the cross. With him, our lives can be full of purpose, direction, and peace.

No more shanks—just a steady swing toward the life he's called us to live.

Confirmation students continue to learn valuable life skills. In contrast to the Esther story, students examined when

and how to re-examine our views. Students tried to lift a foot while their shoulder and other foot were flat against the wall. Unfortunately, this task was impossible because they couldn't shift their center of gravity.

Students talked about how Christ should be their center. If a belief they hold is keeping them from Jesus,

they need to tear down and rebuild their internal temple (an internal reformation).

During this portion of the month, students looked at examples of social and religious reformation, and how the two interact. Students developed skills they need to self-examine coupled with the knowledge that as long as God centers us, nothing can tear us down.

Noisy Change Offering: Sunday, April 27 for Farm in the Dell

Messiah's Noisy Change on Sunday, April 27 will support Farm In The Dell of the Red River Valley. Farm in the Dell is a Christian centered non-profit organization that focuses on creating community based employment opportunities for people with disabilities. Their mission is to transform disabilities into abilities.

"The most important part of why we do what we do is because we believe every person has great worth in God's eyes, no matter what their abilities are."

Farm In The Dell doesn't just plant produce and flowers. Their 6 acre garden provides employment and learning opportunities which teach discipline and increase self confidence and feelings of worthiness. With guidance and instruction, they learn valuable skills working in the gardens from planting through harvest. They both acquire vocational training and learn life skills, as well as business/marketing skills. They learn purposeful work




that fills their spirits, sharpens their minds and cultivates joy. They also learn business/marketing skills by seeing how the garden produce gets integrated into the community. This helps them feel like they really belong to their community and supports the yearly cycle of giving. People with disabilities WANT to give back to their community and they CAN give back.

You can also become a CSA shareholder. CSA is Community Supported Agriculture is a membership that gives you & your family a variety of freshly picked vegetables once the gardens start producing. This provides immediate income for Farm in the Dell to buy seeds and begin planting. The foods are healthy, locally grown, and pesticide free, plus you have the satisfaction of knowing its origin. 


